



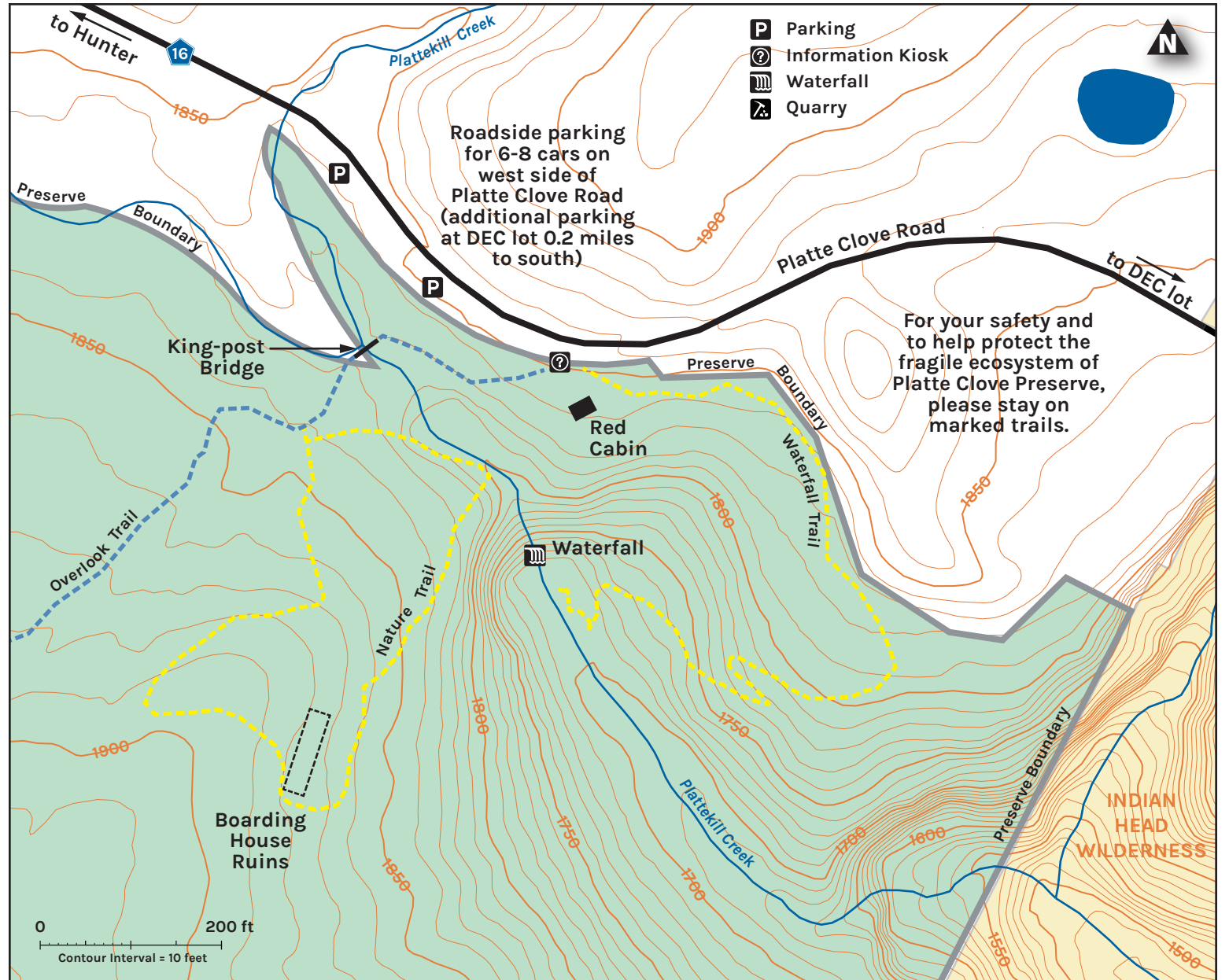
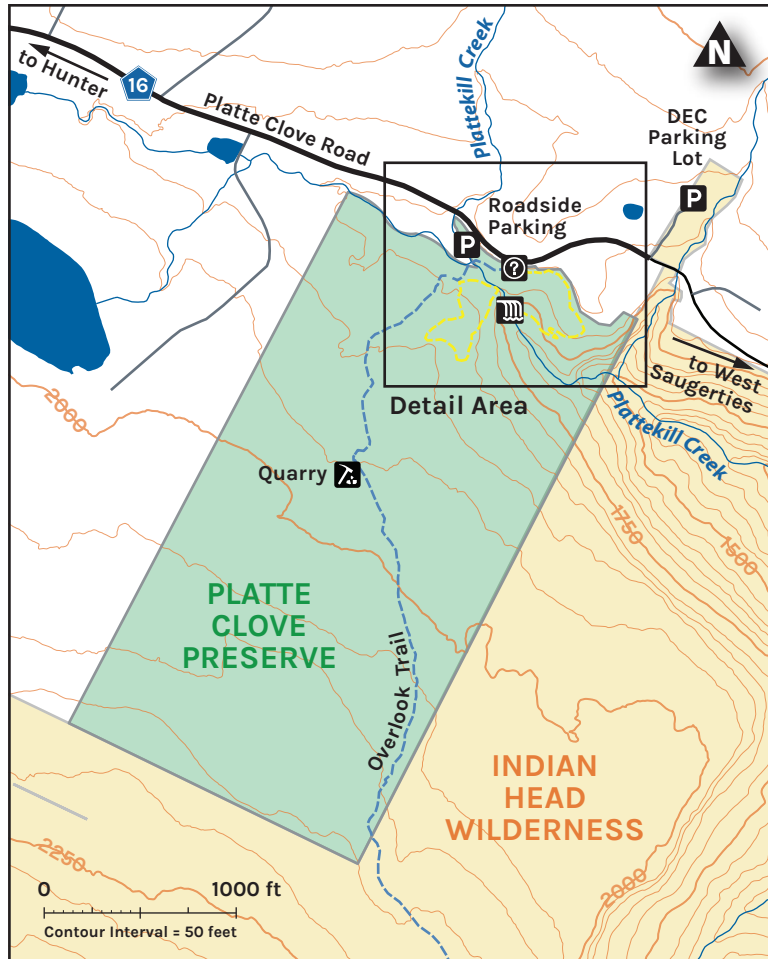

For your safety and to help protect the fragile ecosystem of Platte Clove Preserve, please stay on marked trails.

This 208-acre Wilderness Preserve was donated to Catskill Center in 1975 for the permanent protection of its flora, fauna and historic, cultural and geological features. Platte Clove is part of the eastern Catskill Escarpment which has been gouged by glaciers and carved by streams. The Catskill cloves have a rich history, including their immortalization by the Hudson River School of American landscape artists. The Preserve hosts a portion of the Long Path (see "Overlook Trail") as well as two other trails: the Waterfall Trail, which leads to the largest waterfall onsite and the Nature Trail Loop which passes through site ruins.
